I have wide research interests (150 peer reviewed papers and climbing) and my particular expertise is psychometrics and methodology generally, more quantitative than qualitative though very much a supporter of qualitative work. Much of my research output has been around the CORE system of therapy change measures (<http://www.coresystemtrust.org.uk/>) and particularly co-leading their translation from English into other languages (all the EU languages except for Latvian and Irish now!)
